\square Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
\square Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
☐ Can I be trusted?
\square Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
\square Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
\square Did the Bible live in me today?
\square Do I give [the Bible] time to speak to me every day?
☐ Am I enjoying prayer?
☐ When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
☐ Do I pray about the money I spend?
\square Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
☐ Do I disobey God in anything?
\square Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
\square Am I defeated in any part of my life?
\square Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?
\square How do I spend my spare time?
☐ Am I proud?
\square Do I thank God I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
\square Is there anyone I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard?
\square If so, what am I doing about it?
\square Do I grumble and complain constantly?
